Highlands Council Sets The Date To Adopt Regional Master Plan

Additional Council meetings scheduled to meet deadline

CHESTER, N.J. – The Highlands Council today announced a schedule that would allow them to consider the adoption of the Regional Master Plan at a meeting **on Thursday, July 17 at 10 a.m.** Six additional Council meetings also were added to the meeting schedule to ensure that adequate time was given to consider comments received and incorporate appropriate changes in the Regional Master Plan.

“We are in the home stretch in adopting the Regional Master Plan for the Highlands, and it is important that we give the Council and Staff enough time to do whatever work that is needed in refining the document so we adopt the best Plan possible,” said John Weingart, Chairman of the Highlands Council. “We have set July 17 as our final deadline, and these additional meetings give us ample time to meet this goal.”

These meetings will be held at the Highlands Council's office at 100 North Road in Chester. Any changes to times or locations of meetings will be made only with adequate advance public notice.
