
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Unique Needs of NJ Highlands Habitats


- The Highlands Region hosts unique and protected habitats. Upland Forests are highly protected in the Highlands Region.
- RMP Objective: *1F5b: No Net Loss of Habitat Values*.
- BUT not all habitats and forests are equal.



 How do you value a complex habitat and establish standards to implement No Net Loss? How do you know what it is worth?



Functional Ecosystem Valuation (FEV) Why, How and Who will use it?

- Habitat Valuation Models: limited availability/complex systems have not been modelled.
- Highlands FEV Model developed to assess ecosystem values.
 - A Site Score is compiled from site assessment, fieldworkderived index of biological integrity, and GIS analysis.

Uses of FEV:

- Guiding the location of a development footprint & quantifying mitigation
- Monitoring ecological responses to forestry and land stewardship practices
- Identify and prioritize natural habitats of high value for preservation



Where we are

- **Draft FEV Methodology** has been prepared by consulting team and evaluated by staff.
- Field Testing and Validation RFP to be issued shortly, with anticipated award in early 2020.
- Completion of Forest Conservation Guidance
 - Intended users: Conforming Municipalities, conservation land managers, private landowners.
